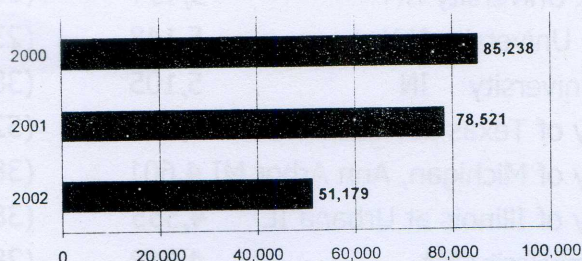

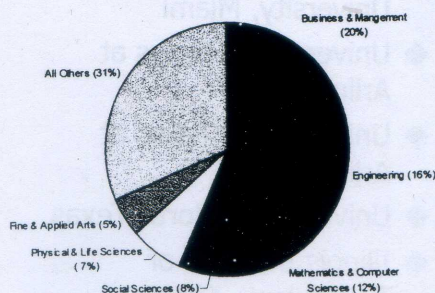


Leading Fields of Study, 2002/2003

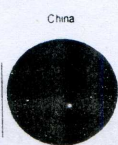

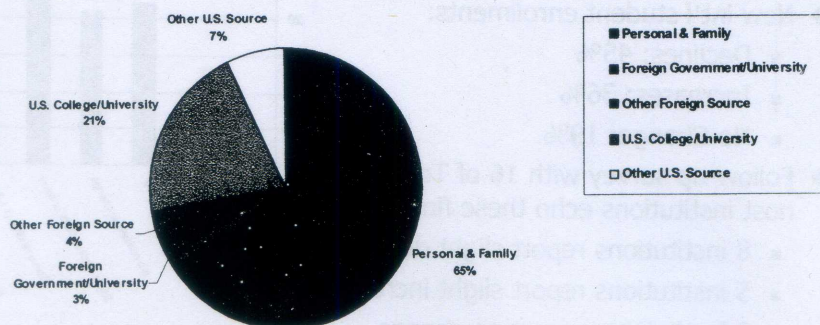

Fall 2003 International Student Enrollments

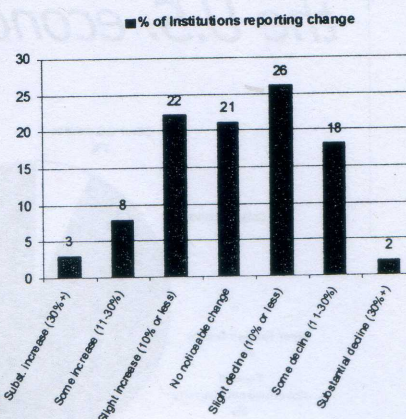
- ◆ Total international student enrollments for fall 2003 vary widely. 46% report some declines. 54% report steady or growing enrollments.

- ◆ New int'l student enrollments:

- Declines: 45%
- Increases: 36%
- No Change: 19%

- ◆ Follow-up survey with 16 of Top 20 host institutions echo these findings:

- 8 institutions report slight decline
- 5 institutions report slight increases
- 3 institutions report no change

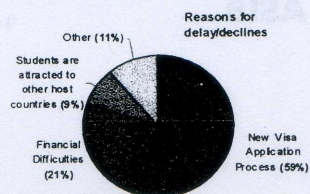
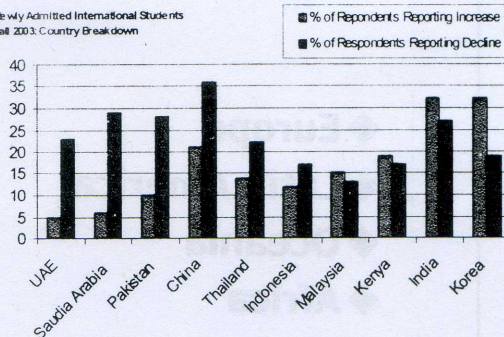

Fall 2003 Enrollments By Students From Major Sending and Islamic Countries

- ◆ Declines in enrollments in many major sending countries with large Islamic populations, especially United Arab Emirates, Saudi Arabia, and Pakistan
- ◆ More campuses report increases for India, Korea, Kenya.
- ◆ Reasons for declines/delays, combination of:
 - Visa Application Process
 - Financial Difficulties
 - Attraction to other host countries

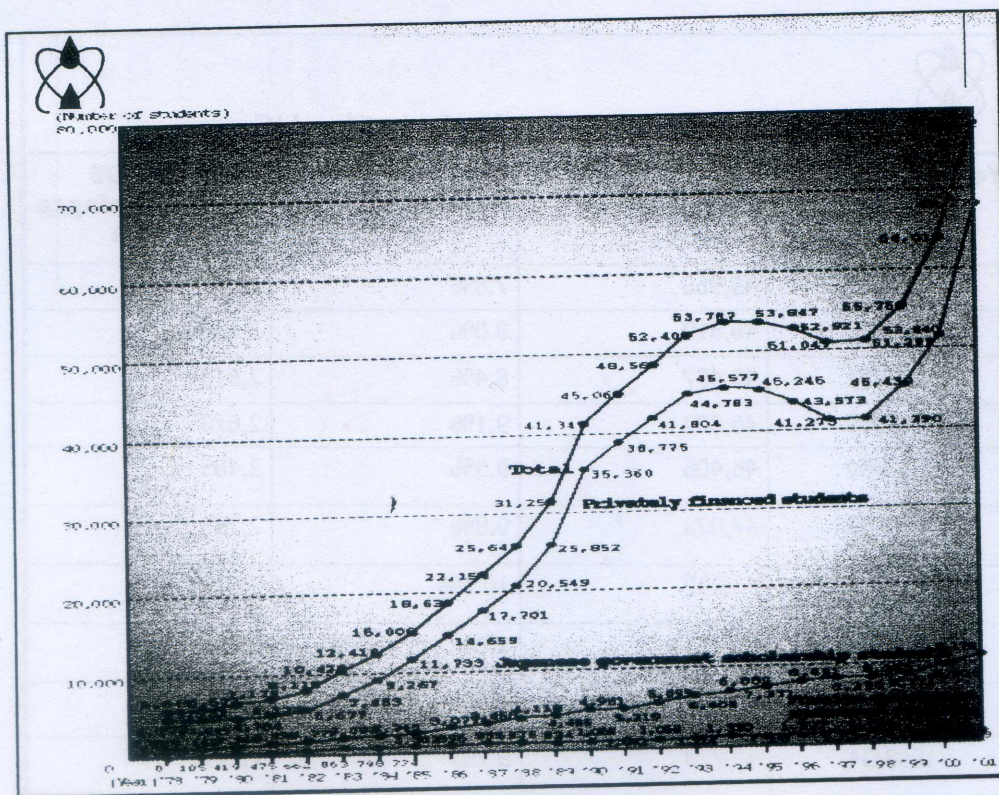
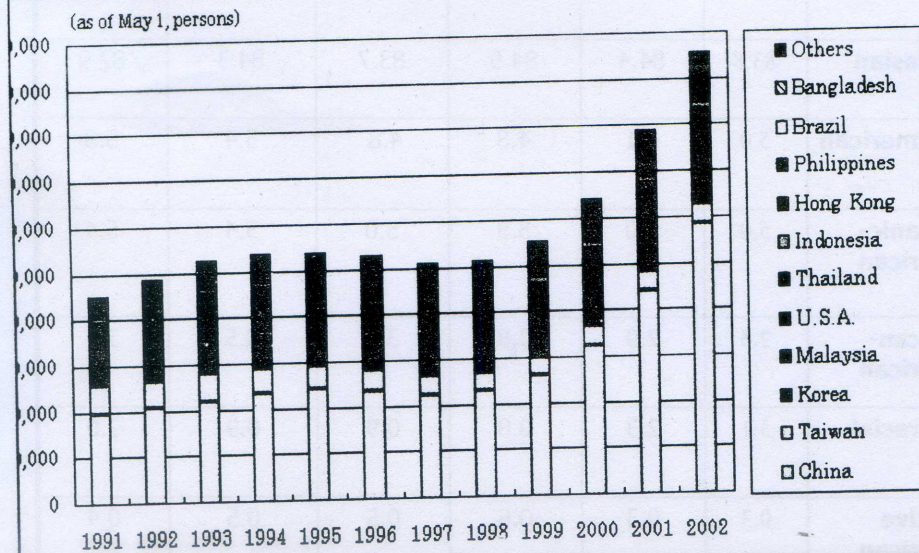
